Non-Metered Service

Availability:

Available to municipal, county, state, and federal governments, quasi-governmental entities, and public districts for electric service for loads that serve the purpose of providing public safety. Eligible loads include but are not limited to traffic signals, flashing lights, flashing signs, lighted roadway signs, vehicle sensors, and security cameras.

Service hereunder shall be limited to locations where the Cooperative determines that such energy usage is of a non-fluctuating nature, and a meter location is hazardous to the public, or where it may not be economical to install metering equipment.

Service is eligible to locations where the consumer's aggregate load is limited to 2,500 Watts.

Applicability:

Applicable to all eligible consumers served by the Cooperative who have entered a Non-Metered Service Agreement with the Cooperative.

Type of Service:

Single-phase, 60 cycles, at Cooperative's standard secondary voltages. Non-metered service shall be provided by the Cooperative using single-phase, line-side conductors. The Cooperative will make all terminations at the point of delivery.

Determination of Load:

At the time of service establishment, the Cooperative will estimate the monthly energy usage based on the load ratings of the consumer's connected facilities. The consumer shall notify the Cooperative before changing facilities or adding additional load.

Service changes that result in load exceeding 2,500 Watts must be metered and are no longer eligible for non-metered service. Consumers are responsible for any costs associated with adding or relocating the Cooperative's facilities to facilitate a change to a metered service.

Base Power Cost, per kWh	\$0.08467
Energy Delivery Cost, per kWh	\$0.03217

Adjustments

The Base Power Cost may be adjusted annually based upon projected wholesale power costs. These adjustments and impacts on Energy Charge will be published at least 30 days prior to their effective dates.

In addition to the rates and charges described above, consumers will be billed a monthly Power Cost Adjustment for all kWh consumed.
