Grand Valley Power Selects 2018 Scholarship Winners

Seven students awarded GVP scholarships for continuing education

GRAND JUNCTION, COLO. - (March 26, 2018) — The Grand Valley Power Scholarship Committee has selected seven outstanding students to receive scholarships to pursue undergraduate degrees. Grand Valley Power has given over \$167,000 since 1996, and education and training is a thread that weaves throughout our cooperative principles.

The committee determines who is selected based on academic performance, reference letters, essay composition, achievements, financial need and community or school involvement.

The 2018 scholarship recipients are listed below:

Jack Broughton – Colorado Mesa University Scholarship - \$2,000 (renewable for three years)
